- ❖ The template with requisite details available for download should be printed and pasted on the cover.
- ❖ Application Registration Number (AR Number) will be assigned by the Selection Committee.
- ❖ Candidates can track their applications on the websites by entering either their application number or the Plus Two / Equivalent Examination Register Number of first appearance with the year.
- A Random number generated by computer will be assigned to each candidate.
- ❖ Eligible candidates who have not received their call letters for counseling can download their call letters from the websites www.tnhealth.org / www.tnmedicalselection.org by entering their AR No. allotted by the Selection Committee and their Date of Birth. They are instructed to attend the counseling as per the date and time mentioned in the counseling schedule which will also be available on the websites. Candidates are requested to paste their photograph on the call letter which is to be attested by a Gazetted Officer. (The photograph must be a copy of the same one pasted on the application)

1. GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS:-

a) Candidates seeking admission to Diploma in Nursing course should submit the application form with necessary enclosures which should reach:-

on or before 23.10.2017 by 5.00 p.m.

- b) The candidates shall ensure that the completed application form with all particulars and enclosures reaches the Selection Committee within the date and time specified. Applications received by Speed Post/Courier or any other means after the last date & time will not be accepted irrespective of the date of booking.
- c) The Selection Committee shall not be responsible for any delay in the receipt or for the loss in transit of application form etc.
- d) Request for extension of time for submission of documents called for, after the specified date and time **will not be entertained.**
- e) Any supporting documents/application received after due date will not be entertained.
- f) Candidates seeking admission under Special Category for the Diploma in Nursing course (Orthopaedically Physically disabled, Eminent Sportsperson, Children of Ex-Servicemen) shall submit the prescribed format available in the Prospectus along with the application. If the certificates are not enclosed, the candidates will not be considered under that category without any intimation to the candidates. (Please see format in the Annexure II, III &IV)
- g) No oral enquiry would be entertained.
- h) Photocopy/ Fax copy of the application will not be accepted.
- i) Both upper limbs, vision and hearing should be normal for all candidates including for candidates applying under Orthopaedically Physically disabled category.

2. ELIGIBILITY:-

The candidate should be a citizen of India.

3.NATIVITY

- a. Candidates should be a Native of Tamil Nadu.
- b. Candidates who have studied from VIII to XII standards in schools of Tamil Nadu need not enclose the "Nativity Certificate".
- c. Candidates who are native of Tamil Nadu but studied from VIII to XII standard either partly or completely in schools situated outside Tamil Nadu should produce the "Nativity Certificate".
- d. The Certificate of Nativity in Tamil Nadu should be issued by the competent authority only in the specified format available in the Prospectus and supported by a copy of Ration Card. If the copy of the supporting document is not produced, then the application will be rejected. Nativity Certificate submitted later will be summarily rejected.
- e. Application without a proper Nativity Certificate will not be considered.
- f. Permanent Residence Certificate will not be accepted.
- g. Candidates who are native of Tamil Nadu alone will be considered for communal reservation.
- Note: i. Nativity Certificate should be produced as per Instructions for Nativity Certificate in Annexure XII a & b.
 - ii) Producing false Nativity Certificate if detected at any time later during the course of study will result in expulsion of the candidate and also initiation of criminal proceedings against the candidate as well as the Parents as per law.

4. AGE LIMIT:-

Minimum age will be 17 years and maximum age limit is 35 years as on 31st December 2017.

5.EDUCATIONAL QUALIFICATION:-

- a. Candidates should have passed in all the subjects of the qualifying examination of the Higher Secondary Certificate Examination conducted by the Tamil Nadu State Board /any other equivalent Board in the following group of subjects.
- 1. **65**% of the seats will be filled up with candidates in the following subjects.
- i. Physics, Chemistry, Biology with any other subject.
- ii. Physics, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology.
- **2. 25**% of the seats will be filled up with candidates in the following subjects.
- i. Vocational Nursing) with Nursing
- ii. Foundation Science as Vocational subject.
- **3 a. 10%** of the seats will be filled with candidates in the subject not specified in items 1 and 2 above.
- b. b. If adequate number of eligible candidates are not available in item 2 and 3, the seats will be reverted back to item 1.
- c. Candidates who have passed the HSC in open university are not eligible to apply for Diploma in Nursing course.
- iii. d. Candidates who have already completed Diploma in Nursing course are not eligible to apply.

6. MINIMUM ELIGIBILITY MARKS:-

a. OC, BC, BCM & MBC/DNC Candidates-

A pass in HSC with 40% of aggregate of marks.

b. SC/SCA/ST candidates

A pass in HSC.

c. Candidates should have studied **Tamil as the first language.**

d. Normalization Of Marks: -

As per the Tamil Nadu Act No.3 of 2007 dt. 05.03.2007 and G.O(Ms) No.77 HE(J2) Dept dt 05.04.2007, the marks obtained by the students in the relevant subjects in the qualifying examination conducted by the various Boards or Authority shall be equated with the marks obtained by the students in the same subjects in the qualifying examination conducted by the State Board of Tamil Nadu by adopting the method of normalization.

Explanation: -

Under the method of normalization, the highest mark obtained by the students of various Boards in each subject will be equated to the highest mark obtained by the students of State Board in that subject and the relative marks obtained by other students in that subject will be determined accordingly.

Illustration: -

If the highest mark secured by the student of State Board in Physics is 100 and the highest mark secured by a student of any other Board in the same subject is 90, both the highest mark will be considered to be equal to 100. If a student of the other Board secures 60 marks in Physics when the first mark in Physics in the same board is 90, then 60 marks will be considered to be equal to 66.66 marks as arrived at below:-

$$\frac{100 \times 60}{90}$$
 = 66.66%

After normalization of marks in the relevant subjects in the qualifying examination conducted by different Boards, the qualified students of different Boards will be merged into a common merit list.

e. In case of candidates who have qualified from National Boards such as CBSE and ISCE etc. the highest marks obtained by the candidates at the National Level alone will be taken into consideration for normalization.

PROCEDURE FOR FILLING AND SUBMISSION OF APPLICATION:-

- 7.a. Before filling up the application form and OMR sheets, read all the instructions carefully.
- b. Each application form bears a unique number which is printed on the Application form and the OMR Sheet. Candidates are requested to check the number and ensure that the same number is printed on the Application form, Outer cover, Inner cover and OMR sheet. In case any discrepancy is noted, it should be immediately brought to the notice of the Selection Committee before the last date for the receipt of applications. However the serial number of the OMR sheet will be considered as the final number for correspondence purposes.
- c. No candidate should submit more than one application.
- d. If a candidate applies in forms other than the one prescribed for the academic year i.e 2017-2018 session, the application will be summarily rejected.

- 8. Fill up the application form and OMR sheet legibly, neatly and correctly.
- 9.Do not fold OMR sheet under any circumstances. Making a hole, using a pin or a stapler on the OMR sheet should be avoided. Cutting, Overwriting and erasing in the Application form and in the OMR sheet or Scrutiny Form (for downloaded applications) should be strictly avoided.
- 10. Application with incomplete or insufficient particulars or **without enclosures** or those received after the last date mentioned will be summarily rejected without any intimation to the candidate.
- 11. Filled up applications without the signature of the candidates will be rejected.
- 12.a. Candidates should affix recent passport size photographs **taken with** name and date (as shown in the Instructions- Annexure X) in the places provided in the application form and the OMR sheet. The photograph pasted in the application form alone should be duly attested by Group A or Group B officer of the Government of Tamil Nadu or Central Government or the Head of the Institution last studied.
- b. The Registration/ Roll number allotted by the Directorate of Government Examination/ concerned Boards should be indicated along with the year of +2 examination/ equivalent in the application.
 - 13. All the entries in the application form should be written legibly by the candidate in her own handwriting. The candidate should ensure that all information including the marks in the qualifying examination furnished by her in the application and the enclosures are correct. The candidate is informed that if after proper scrutiny of her application, the marks furnished by her in the application are not correct or any other information is found to be incorrect, then;
- a. She has to forfeit the admission no matter at what stage of the course, she will be at that time.
- b. She will be debarred from pursuing any studies for a period of three years.
- c. Legal action will be initiated against the candidate and the parent/guardian for furnishing incorrect information.
- d. Criminal action will be initiated against her for furnishing false Mark sheets/false Community certificate/false nativity certificate.
- 14. Candidates are instructed to enclose only the photocopies (not original) of the following certificates in the order indicated below along with the application.
- a. Mark sheet(s) of H.S.C. examination/any other equivalent examination duly endorsed by the competent authority. Photo copy of both the sides of the mark sheets should be enclosed.
- b. Transfer certificate obtained after the completion of H.S.C. or equivalent courses.
- c. Nativity certificate (if applicable).
- d. Permanent Community Certificate Card(if applicable)
- e. Candidates seeking Admission against Special Category seats should submit necessary certificates obtained from appropriate authorities in the prescribed form and submit them along with the application to the Selection Committee. (Please see format in the Annexure II, III & IV.)
- f. X standard Mark Sheet.
- g. Certificate for proof of study from VIII standard to XII standard.
- h. H.S.C Hall Ticket

Note:

- i. The candidates belonging to Scheduled Tribe should produce Community Certificate obtained from a Competent Authority not below the rank of a Revenue Divisional Officer. An attested photo copy or certified copy of the permanent community certificate card should be produced. If she claims ST status in the application without producing any evidence or claiming that ST status is under process of scrutiny then she will be treated as open category candidate.
- ii. Producing a false community, Nativity or any other certificate if detected later at any point of time during the course of study will result in expulsion of the candidate and also criminal proceedings will be initiated against the candidate as well as the parents as per provision of law.
- iii. As number of bogus community certificates are being encountered off late and in order to curb such practices, the authentication of the above certificate has to be verified and confirmed by the concerned authority, before the individual completes 1st year. The concerned candidate and parents should take necessary steps to that effect. Unless proof of authenticity of community certificate is received, the candidate will not be allowed to continue the 2nd year.
- 15. Community Certificates obtained from other States will not be considered and such candidates will be treated as open category.

DETERMINATION OF RANK OF CANDIDATES OBTAINING EQUAL MARKS:

- 16.In cases where two or more candidates obtain equal total marks of the subjects (except Tamil and English) for 100, the rank of such candidates shall be determined.
- a. Percentage of marks in Nursing as Vocational/ Academic Subject.
- b. Marks in Biology or Botany and Zoology taken together in +2 Examination
- c. Marks in Physics and Chemistry taken together in +2 Examination.
- d. Number of attempts in Higher Secondary Course.
- e. Date of Birth -Weightage will be given to Seniority in Age.
- f. Computerized random number assigned. Higher value of random number will be taken into consideration.

MERIT LIST:-

- 17. The Secretary, Selection Committee will publish the merit lists in the website: 1) www.tnhealth.org / 2) www.tnmedicalselection.org
- 18. The Candidates will be called for counselling as per their merit and they may exercise their option as per their eligibility norms mentioned in the Prospectus.

COUNSELLING PROCEDURE (SINGLE WINDOW SYSTEM):-

19. The selection will be made on merit basis and by Counselling applying the rule of reservation by the Government of Tamil Nadu as follows:-

Open Competition - 31 % Backward Class - 30 %

Most Backward /

Denotified Community - 20 % Scheduled Caste - 18 % Scheduled Tribe - 1 %

Within 30% reservation for BC, 3.5% reservation will be provided for BC Muslims and within 18% of reservation for SC candidates, 16% of seats out of 18% quota earmarked to SC shall be allotted to the Arunthathiyar community. BC, BCM, MBC, DNC, SC, SCA & ST are eligible for selection under open competition as per merit in addition to the reservation made for them.

- a). Any remaining unfilled seats for want of adequate number of eligible candidates belonging to SCA community shall be filled by candidates belonging to SC community other than Arunthathiyar as per merit and vice versa. (GO (Ms) 55 P & AR Department, Dated: 08.04.2010)
- b). Any remaining reserved seats in ST Quota for want of adequate number of eligible candidates belonging to ST community shall be allotted to candidates belonging to SC Community as per merit. (GO (Ms) No.77 Health & Family Welfare Department (MCA1) Dated 24.02.2011)
- c). Any remaining unfilled seats in BCM Community for want of adequate number of eligible candidates after exhausting the merit list shall be filled up on merit basis by candidates belonging to BC community without exceeding the quota for BC community as a whole (G.O.Ms.No.30/H&FW Dept(MCA1) Dated 18.01.2012)
- d). Even after filling up of the required seats reserved for Arunthathiyars on preferential basis, if more number of qualified Arunthathiyars are available, such excess number of candidates of Arunthathiyars shall be entitled to compete with the Scheduled Castes other than Arunthathiyars in the interse merit among them (As per G.O.Ms.No.65, P &AR(K)Department, Dated:27.07.2009.
- 20. Counselling schedule will be available on the websites. Candidates who have not received the Call Letter in time can also attend the counselling as per schedule and as per their merit with call letters downloaded from the websites. (www.tnhealth.org / www.tnmedicalselection.org)
- 21. a.Counselling for the Special Categories will be done before the General Category.
- b.There will be **no re-allotment**/change of college allotted for the Special Category.
- 22. One of the Parents will be allowed to attend the counselling. Individual call letter will be sent for counselling.
- 23. (i) Option once exercised during counselling will be final and cannot be changed.
 - (ii) (a) Candidates who fail to attend the counselling at the specified date and time will forfeit their right to admission and their name will not be considered later.
- (b) Due to unforeseen reasons, if a candidate could not attend the counselling on the specified date and time, she can attend on a subsequent time/date during that counselling and allowed to take the course and college available at the time of counselling when she actually attends.

(or)

She can authorize her parent on her behalf and the parent's decision will be binding on the candidate. The authorization letter must be in the prescribed format in the Annexure XI a & b.

(c) If the candidate is absent during the 1st phase of counselling for which she is called, cannot attend the subsequent phase of counselling.

- 24. a) At the time of counselling, candidates can choose the College/ Training centre of their choices on merit basis and the same will be allotted as per the availability of seats.
- b) Candidates can exercise their option for the course and the College/Training Centre of their own choice at the time of counselling and allotment will be subject to availability of seats
- c) They are eligible to attend the counselling for re-allotment of Colleges/ Training Centre. The date of such counselling will be published in the websites and also will be informed to the Dean/Joint Director of Health Services of respective Colleges/ Training Centres. No individual intimation will be sent to the candidates.
- d) The movement of candidate from one College/ Training Centre to another College/Training Centre will be based on merit following the rule of reservation.
- e) Individual request for transfer of College/Training Centre will not be entertained.
- f) Mutual transfer will not be entertained.
- g) The selection is only provisional. The selection and admission is liable to be cancelled at any time as and when the eligibility conditions are found to be defective in addition to revelation of suppressed and overlooked facts.
- 25. a. All communications will be sent only to the mailing address given in the application. The call letters will be sent either by Registered Post, Speed Post, Courier Service or by e.post whichever is feasible. Selection Committee is not responsible for any Postal delay or non receipt of call letters.
- b. Any change or modification and relevant information pertaining to this admission process will be made available immediately on the websites. (www.tnmedicalselection.org) The candidates are instructed to frequently visit the website from the date of application till the end of counselling without fail. Please do not wait for counselling information to be received by post, as all information including the date of counselling will be put up in the websites. Call letters can also be downloaded from the websites. Candidates will be permitted for counselling accordingly.
- c. Call letter calling for counselling does not guarantee admission since more number of candidates are called than the actual number of vacancies.
- d. The Selection committee is not responsible for non- receipt of call letter due to improper/ incomplete address written by the candidate in the envelope.
- e. All candidates attending the counselling will have to remit a non-refundable amount of Rs. 200/- by means of Demand Draft drawn in favour of "The Secretary, Selection Committee" as processing fee.

CATEGORIES OF SEATS:-

26. Students will be admitted under the following categories on merit basis.

Category - I Stipendiary

Category - II Stipendiary(TAHDCO)

(For SC/SCA/ST/SC converted Christians only)

The stipend will be paid as follows for the students admitted in Diploma in Nursing course from 2017-2018 session as per G.O.Ms. No.34/H&FW (PME)Dept. Dated:07.02.2014.

First Year : Rs. 600/- per month Second Year : Rs. 700/- per month Third Year : Rs. 800/- per month

Rs.800/- shall be paid for the period of internship training.

The rate of Stipend is liable to be revised at any time without prior notice.

SPECIAL CATEGORIES: -

- 27.(a) Seats earmarked for the Special Categories will be allotted following the Horizontal Reservation. The Seats will be allotted as per merit order in the concerned special category and those seats will be deducted in the concerned compartment (OC / BC / BCM / MBC / DNC / SC / SCA / ST) and the remaining seats will be allotted to the General Category
- (b) If adequate number of eligible candidates are not available under Special Category the earmarked seats will be reverted back to general category.
- (c) The other eligibility conditions for admission will be applicable in the case of General Category.

(i)Seats Reserved for Children of Ex-Servicemen: (No of seats reserved: 57)

The candidate should furnish a certificate as prescribed in the Format in Annexure-II obtained from the competent authority.

The special committee from the defence authorities constituted for this purpose will scrutinize certificates submitted by the candidates. Eligible candidates will be selected on merit basis.

(ii) Seats- Reserved for Eminent Sportsperson.(No of seats reserved:3)

Selection will be done by the Common Committee constituted for this purpose. The mode of selection will be made as per the guidelines given in Annexure III. The candidates are requested to arrange the certificates as per the serial number starting from June 2012 as given in the Annexure III and submit along with the applications. All the particulars are to be filled up as per the guidelines given in the Annexure – III.

(iii)Seats Reserved for Orthopaedically Physically Disabled.

(No of seats reserved:)

5% of the total number of seats available in Government Institutions are reserved for the Orthopaedically Physically disabled candidates. The candidates with disability of lower limbs between **40% to 50%** shall be considered. The other conditions will be applicable as in the case of the general category.

The candidates are required to produce a certificate from the District Medical Board of the area concerned constituted for the purpose of assessing the nature and the extent of disability in the format prescribed in the Annexure-IV(a)& (b). The Certificate must have been obtained within three months prior to submitting the application. If the Certificate has been obtained earlier, the application will be rejected.

The Medical Certificate issued by District Medical Board of the area concerned for this purpose is subject to the confirmation by the Expert Committee constituted by the Director of Medical Education at the time of counselling.

Candidates seeking admission under this category should produce a full size photograph exhibiting the deformity.

Note:-

- i. The selected candidates will be required to undergo second Medical Examination by a Medical Board constituted for the purpose by the Director of Medical Education to ascertain and confirm the nature and extent of physical disability.
- ii) The Candidates with any other disability other than the locomotory disability of the lower limb will not be considered under this special category. Such application will be summarily rejected without any information to the candidate.
- iii) Both upper limbs, vision and hearing should be normal.
- iv) The decision of the Director of Medical Education in this regard will be final.
- v) Candidates who applied previously under Orthopaedically Physically Disabled category and were rejected by Special Medical Board constituted by the Director of Medical Education for this purpose are not eligible to apply under this category. Such application will be summarily rejected.

DURATION OF THE COURSE: -

28. Three years including six months Internship (As per norms fixed by Indian Nursing Council/ Government).

29. FEE DETAILS:-

- a. Candidates who have been selected under Orthopaedically disabled category are exempted from paying the Tuition Fee and Special Fee.
- b. All candidates should pay mess charges, etc.,
- c. Students of SC/SCA/ ST community, whose Parents / Guardian's annual income is less than Rs.2,50,000/- (Rupees Two Lakhs and fifty Thousand Only) and for SC converted Christianity students whose parents/guardians annual income is less than Rs.2,00,000/-(Rupees Two Lakhs Only) are exempted from payment of all compulsory, non-refundable fees (enrollment/ Registration, Tuition, Games, Union, Library, Magazine, Medical Examination and such other fee Compulsory Non refundable fees fixed by the Fee Committee. The fee, so exempted shall be claimed by the respective Instituion under the Scholarship programme of the Government of India. (As per G.O,(Ms).No.6 AD & TW Dept. dated 09.01.2012) and G.O. Ms.No.51/ AD & TW Dept. dated 07.08.2013 and as per G.O.(Ms).No.92/AD and TW Dept. dated.11.09.2012.
- 30.a. The selected candidates will be called for verification of certificates by the Head of Nursing training centre concerned. Candidates will have to produce the original documents at the time of verification. Selection will be cancelled if the candidate do not produce all the original documents as required.

- b. All the selected candidates should stay **compulsorily in the Hostel** during the entire period of study.
- 31. The candidates have to undergo Medical examination by the Medical Board constituted at the Training Centre to which they are allotted. Only those candidates found medically fit will be admitted and be permitted to pay the fee.
- 32. Candidates selected for admission will have to sign the discipline declaration form in Annexure-IX with her Parent / Guardian. Failure to sign the declaration will result in cancellation of selection.
- 33. All selection and admission are only provisional. The selection and admission is liable to be cancelled at any time as and when the eligibility conditions are found to be defective or incorrect or there has been any suppression or misrepresentation of facts. The selection committee reserves the right to cancel the allotment.

34. COMMUNICATION:-

All intimation for communication to the candidates will be sent only to the mailing address given by the candidate at the time of submission of application. The Intimation / Call Letters will either be sent by Registered Post or Speed Post or Courier Service or e-Post or they can be downloaded from the Websites www.tnhealth.org / www.tnhealth.org / www.tnmedicalselection.org as per instructions in Page 2 of this Prospectus whichever is feasible depending on the availability of time before counselling. Selection Committee will not be held responsible for Postal Delay and non viewing of website.

35. HEPATITIS -B- VACCINATION:-

All candidates selected should take the Hepatitis-B-Vaccine before admission and produce a certificate as in Annexure – VI.

36. **RAGGING:** -

The candidates who join should not indulge or participate in any kind of ragging throughout their study period. If they are found to have indulged in ragging at any time, the candidate **will be removed** from the roll of the Institution at whatever stage of study and **criminal action** will be taken against the candidate.

- 3. Any tournaments conducted by the Federations which are derecognized by the IOA or MYAS at National level for a particular period will not be considered for award of marks.

(c) For State Tournaments:

- 1. The State level tournaments should officially be recognized as the regular annual championship/ tournament by respective official State Association /SAI/ SDAT will be considered (for each year) for the award of marks.

- 1. This Certificate should be issued by an officer of the Revenue Department not below the rank of Tahsildar in the Taluk concerned.
- 2. This Certificate should not be issued by the Special Tahsildars, Deputy Tahsildars such as Loans, Land Acquisition, Election, Excise and HQs, Deputy Tahsildars, Special Deputy Collectors, Assistant Commissioner of Agricultural Income, Excise, Elections etc.
- 3. This Certificate should be signed also by the Village Administrative Officer.
- 4. The Certificate should bear the stamp of the office of the Officer signing the Certificate.
- 5. Any foreign national irrespective of the period of study in the State will not become eligible to apply for this course. No certificate of Nativity in the State of Tamil Nadu, should therefore be issued to Nationals of other countries for this purpose.
- 6. The certifying officers should insist upon clear proof of the Nativity of the Parent or Guardian of the candidate and satisfy themselves on the genuineness of the residential qualification.

They should be particularly careful in the case of candidates whose mother tongue is not Tamil and whose place of birth is other than Tamil Nadu and who have studied VIII to XII standards outside Tamil Nadu.

- 7. Residence Certificate will not be considered as Nativity Certificate.
- 8. The guidelines prescribed for the issue of Nativity Certificate are as per Letter No.RA.V(B)16932/2000, dated 3-4-2000 of the Special Commissioner and Commissioner of Revenue Administration, Chepauk, Chennai-5.
 - (i) The parents/guardians of the applicants/students or the applicants themselves should have permanently resided continuously for a period of five years in Tamil Nadu.
 - (ii) Permanently residing for a period of five years should be supported by documentary evidence.
 - (iii) The family ration card, Electoral Roll, Census List if taken recently, documents like sale deed, tax receipt etc. relating to the property owned by either of the parents or by the applicant may be verified.
 - (iv) The Transfer Certificate issued by the School authorities where the applicant had studied last may be verified to know whether she was in the State for five years.
 - (v) Enquiry in the village / place of residence of the neighbour / Village Administrative Officers regarding continuous residing.
 - (vi) To ensure that wrong or incorrect address had not been furnished to obtain the certificate.
 - (vii) The birth place of the present, place of residence of the parent / father, permanent assets, mother tongue, place of education, place of marriage of the applicant / parents, the period of stay in and outside Tamil Nadu can also be considered before issuing certificate.
